

Losing Contact

The techniques will work with any pens,
but will be easier to learn with a larger size nib, 6 to 12 mm.

My favorite is the Horizon pen*, which is similar to Coits or Hiros — folded metal pens.
Automatics are okay.
Parallels and classic nibs like Brause, Mitchell or Tape are acceptable,
but the bigger the better.

* Horizons are only available from Paper and Ink Arts in the US.

The 1/4 inch and 3/8 inch are also good. Don't get one bigger than 1/2 inch.

Non-waterproof ink.
